

In 1946, the company opened its first plant in Osaka. A year later the corporation was established. By 1948, the "Clover" name was acquired and the company's plants in Osaka and Kyoto were expanded. Between 1955 and 1962, three more manufacturing plants were built and two branches were opened in Sapporo and Fukuoka. By 1983 Clover Needlecraft, Inc. was opened in Los Angeles, Calif. to service North and South America and the Caribbean. Expansion in Europe was established in 2000 when Clover Euro was opened in Hamburg, Germany.
